- Ongoing Events
 - DRC Ebola Virus Disease (2020) (73 cases; 31 deaths; CFR 42.5%). Six additional cases and zero new deaths have been reported this week. Eight out of 18 heath zones and 27 out of 281 health areas in Equateur Province have reported at least one confirmed or probable case. At least one patient was a confirmed contact, was vaccinated, and was monitored regularly.
 - Kenya Coronavirus Disease (22,053 cases; 369 deaths; CFR 1.7%). The outbreak continues to escalate, with 46/47 counties reporting cases. Nairobi City and Mombasa have the highest attack rates. Case numbers are doubling roughly every two weeks.
 - South Africa Coronavirus Disease (511,485 cases; 8,366 deaths; CFR 1.5%). The country continues to have the highest number of cases and deaths on the continent. These cases and deaths are heterogeneously distributed throughout the provinces, and community transmission is well established.
