- New Events
- Ongoing Events
 - DRC Ebola Virus Disease (2020) (58 cases; 22 deaths; CFR 37.9%).
 Eight additional cases and two new deaths have been reported this week.
 Six out of 18 heath zones and 19 out of 281 health areas in Equateur Province have reported at least one confirmed or probable case.
 - Gambia Coronavirus Disease (93 cases; 4 deaths; CFR 4.3%). The country remains the least affected on the continent, however there has been a 50% increase in cases in the last 20 days.
 - South Africa Coronavirus Disease (364,328 cases; 5,033 deaths;
 CFR 1.4%). The outbreak is now ranked fifth in the world, and community transmission is well established. South Africa makes up more than half of the cases reported in the African region.
- Humanitarian Crisis
 - DRC. The complex crisis is further complicated by the growing COVID-19 outbreak, the 11th Ebola Virus Disease outbreak, and ongoing outbreaks of measles, cholera, and other infectious diseases. There are thousands of internally displaced and returning peoples, clashes between armed groups, and tense security situations.
