 - Delaware is currently vaccinating persons aged 50 years and older, persons aged 16-64 with high and moderate risk factors, non-paid/family

caregivers of eligible 16-64 year-olds, frontline and other essential employees

• As of 3/28/2021, Delaware has administered 433,516 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine (152,054 are fully vaccinated)

United States

- COVID-19 <u>vaccines</u> may not produce sufficient antibody response in transplant patients
- Evidence that novel coronavirus infects the mouth's cells (NIH)
- How COVID-19 affects the brain (JAMA)
- Impact of the influenza vaccine on COVID-19 infection rates and severity (AJIC)
- US vaccination campaign gains steam as White House speeds shipments

- <u>Antiviral drugs</u> tilorone, quinacrine, and pyronaridine potentially effective against COVID-19
- WHO report says animals likely source of COVID




2020-2021 Flu Season

United States

Seasonal influenza activity in the United States remains lower than usual for this time of year. ILI activity levels may be impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and should be interpreted with caution.
