- NCC 63,262; KC 17,850; SC 25,674
- Hospitalizations: 87, critical: 7
- Delaware Specific COVID-Vaccine Information (de.gov/covidvaccine)
- Delaware Vaccine Release Tracker (MyHealthyCommunity)
 - Delaware is administering vaccine to any resident over the age of 16
 - As of May 16, Delaware has administered 842,194 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine (350,720 are fully vaccinated (36.6%), and 90,271 (46.1%) have had at least one dose).
 - Delaware is lifting capacity restrictions on May 21
 - Delaware has opened four standalone COVID-19 vaccination clinics, 0 which will serve for the next several months as an option for people to be vaccinated (with or without an appointment). Appointments can be made by calling 1-833-643-1715. Clinics will offer vaccines Monday through Friday from 8:30 – 11:30 am and 1:15 – 4:00 pm.

United States

- CDC study: COVID-19 mRNA vaccines 94% effective in health workers
- FDA issues an EUA for the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine for use in adolescents aged 12-15 years (5/10) and ACIP issued an interim recommendation in support of the EUA (5/14)

World

WHO lists additional COVID-19 vaccine for emergency use and issues interim policy recommendations




2020-2021 Flu Season

United States

Seasonal influenza activity in the United States remains lower than usual for this time of year. ILI activity levels may be impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and should be interpreted with caution.
