- <u>Paris</u> imposes restrictions as cases surge




2020-2021 Flu Season

WHO Afro Outbreaks & Emergencies

Week 40: September 28 – October 4, 2020

- New Events
- Ongoing Events
 - DRC Ebola Virus Disease (2020) (128 cases; 53 deaths; CFR 40.3%).
 One additional case and three new deaths have been reported this week.
 Thirteen out of 18 heath zones and 42 out of 281 health areas in
 Equateur Province have reported at least one confirmed or probable case, and three health workers have contracted the disease.
 - Kenya Coronavirus Disease (32,427 cases; 731 deaths; CFR 1.9%).
 The country is among the top ten most affected countries in the African region, however is showing an overall declining trend in new cases.
 - Namibia Hepatitis E (7,954 cases; 65 deaths; CFR 0.8%). The outbreak, declared in December 2017, has been showing a declining trend since May 2019. Cases have mainly been reported from informal settlements, where access to potable water, sanitation, and hygiene is limited.
