


2020-2021 Flu Season

WHO Afro Outbreaks & Emergencies

Week 41: October 5 – 11, 2020

- New Events
- Ongoing Events
 - Cameroon Cholera (1,848 cases; 79 deaths; CFR 4.3%). The outbreak has been ongoing since April. Littoral is the most affected region, and the age group most affected is between 25-35 years, followed by infants.
 - CAR Measles (28,633 cases; 137 deaths; CFR 0.5%). The outbreak was declared in January, and shows a declining trend after peaking in March. The capital and the west of the country are the most affected.
 - DRC Coronavirus Disease (10,841 cases; 276 deaths; CFR 2.5%).
 The country is ranked #14 in the WHO African Region; the number of confirmed cases is declining from a peak in the summer. Kinshasa is the most affected province in the country.
 - DRC Ebola Virus Disease (2020) (128 cases; 53 deaths; CFR 40.3%). Zero additional cases and zero new deaths have been reported since

September 28. Thirteen out of 18 heath zones and 42 out of 281 health areas in Equateur Province have reported at least one confirmed or probable case, and three health workers have contracted the disease. Only one health zone has been active in the past 21 days.
